STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Medomac river and its tributaries in the towns of Union, Washington, Appleton and Liberty.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch, or 2 kill any kind of fish at any time in the Medomac river, from 3 Skidmore's Mill dam in Union and Washington, in Knox

- 4 County, to Light Meadows, so called, in Liberty, in Waldo
- 5 county, or in any of the tributaries to said river from Skid-
- 6 more's Mill dam to Light Meadows, so called, for a period
- 7 of three years from July first, 1909. Provided, however,

- 8 that it shall be lawful to dip chubs for bait with a hand net 9 in said waters.
- Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this 2 act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the 3 general law of the State for the illegal fishing for and catch-4 ing trout and landlocked salmon.
- Sect. 3. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and 2 police courts and trial justices within their respective coun-3 ties, shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent 4 jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior courts, 5 and all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for violation 6 of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving 7 the same to the State Treasurer, and credited to fines and 8 license fees for the protection of birds and game.
