STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT relating to the scaling of logs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Unless the parties otherwise agree, in the scaling or measurement of unmanufactured logs and timber the cubic foot shall be the unit of measure, to be determined by mathematical calculation or by such cubic rule as the parties may agree upon.

Sect. 2. The commission appointed by the Governor under the authority of an order of the last Legislature, of date of March 14, 1907, is hereby continued in office with power to recommend some appropriate standard cubic rule and the application or use thereof. Their report shall be made on or before September first, 1909, to the Governor,

7 who shall transmit the same to the next Legislature for its
8 action thereon. Their bills for time actually employed, at no
9 more than five dollars per day, and actual expenses shall be
10 approved by the Governor and Council and be paid out of
11 any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.
