STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend section forty-two of chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter one hundred one of the Public Laws of 1907, relating to payment of superintendents of towns comprising school unions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section forty-two of chapter fifteen of the Re2 vised Statutes, as amended by chapter one hundred one of
3 the Public Laws of 1907, is amended by striking out, after
4 the word "schools" in line nine of said section the words,
5 "and presentation to the governor and council, a warrant
6 shall be drawn upon the treasurer of the State for the"; and
7 by inserting, after the word "payment" in the eleventh line
8 of said section the words 'shall be made out of the sum ap-

9 propriated for superintendence of towns, comprising school 10 unions and out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise 11 appropriated,' so that said section as amended shall read, as 12 follows:

'Section 42. Whenever the chairman and secretary of said 14 joint committee shall certify under oath to the State superin-15 tendent of schools, according to form prescribed by the State 16 superintendent that a union has been maintained and a super-17 intendent employed as provided in sections forty and forty-18 one of this chapter, which certification shall be made quar-10 terly, on the first days of January, April, July and October 20 of each year, then, upon approval of said certificate by the 21 State superintendent of schools, payment shall be made out of 22 the sum appropriated for superintendence of towns, compris-23 ing school unions and out of any moneys in the treasury not 24 otherwise appropriated to the superintendent so employed 25 of a sum equal to twice the aggregate sum paid by the towns 26 comprising the union, provided that the amount so paid for 27 the benefit of a single union of towns shall not exceed eight 28 hundred dollars in one year.'
