# SEVENTY-FOURTH LEGISLATURE

## STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of the State School for Boys.

Resolved, That there be and are hereby appropriated for and 2 in behalf of the State School for Boys the following sums 3 and for the following purposes, namely: For the year nine-4 teen hundred and nine, for current expenses, thirty-three 5 thousand dollars; for ordinary repairs and improvements, 6 two thousand dollars; for providing homes for boys and 7 visiting boys out on probation, five hundred dollars; for fit-8 ting up dentist's office and employing dentist, five hundred 9 dollars; for exterior painting, five hundred dollars; for new 10 furniture, carpets and fixtures, five hundred dollars; for pur-11 chase of new horses and carriages, nine hundred fifty dollars; 12 for construction of horse barn, six thousand dollars; for ex-13 tending sewer into Long Creek and building catch basin, five

14 hundred dollars; for tools, etc., for manual training school, 15 five hundred dollars; for transportation, six hundred dol-16 lars.

Total, forty-five thousand five hundred and fifty dollars.

For the year nineteen hundred and ten, for current ex-19 penses, thirty-three thousand dollars; for ordinary repairs 20 and improvements, two thousand dollars; for providing 21 homes for boys and visiting boys out on probation, five hun-22 dred dollars; for employment of dentist, three hundred dol-23 lars; for exterior painting, five hundred dollars.

Total, thirty-six thousand three hundred dollars.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The usual appropriation for the State School for Boys for current expenses is \$26,000. In addition to this the statute provides that the State shall pay to the school one dollar per week for the subsistence and clothing of boys; and with an average population of 150 boys (which is less than the average during the past few months), this amount would be \$7,800; or a total cost to the State of \$33,800.00. The number of boys is increasing, but it is believed that \$33,000, as called for in the accompanying resolve will be sufficient for the current expenses during the year 1909.

The rest of the items in the resolve are self-explanatory.
