IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend section 22 of chapter 32 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 5 of chapter 132 of the Public Laws of 1905, relating to payment of damage done to growing crops by deer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Section 1. Section 22 of chapter 32 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 5 of chapter 132 of the Public Laws of 1905, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "deer" in the twenty-fifth line of said section, as amended, the words, "but not more than fifty dollars shall be paid any one person in any one year for damage done by deer to growing crops.
