STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT amending section one of chapter three hundred and fifty of the Private and Special Laws of 1907, relating to the time of service of members of Fire Department of the City of Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section one of chapter three hundred and fif-2 ty of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and 3 seven is hereby amended by striking out said section and in-4 serting in place thereof the following:

'Section I. All members of the fire department of the city 6 of Portland, excepting the assistant engineers, shall be con-7 tinued in the service of said department without reappoint-8 ment, unless removed for inefficiency or other cause or re-

9 tired on arrival at the age limit of sixty years, and all future 10 appointments of members of the fire department, excepting 11 the chief engineer and assistant engineers, shall be made 12 by the board of engineers subject to the approval of the com-13 mittee on fire department; and all members of the fire de-14 partment continued in service or hereafter appointed under 15 the provisions of this act shall hold office during good be-16 havior, subject, however, after a hearing, to removal, ex-17 cept as otherwise provided, at any time by the board of 18 engineers, subject to the approval of the committee on fire 19 department, for inefficiency or other cause. The chief en-20 gineer may, for cause, suspend any member of the fire de-21 partment from duty and such suspension shall continue 'in 22 force until the next meeting of the board of engineers, pro-23 vided said meeting is held within thirty days after said sus-24 pension.

The chief engineer shall be elected by the city council, and 26 shall hold office during good behavor, subject, however, af-27 ter a hearing, to removal at any time by the mayor, by and 28 with the advice and consent of the city council, for ineffi-29 ciency or other cause. Upon reaching the age limit, as here-30 inbefore provided, he may be retired by the mayor, by and 31 with the advice and consent of the city council. The present 32 chief engineer shall continue in office under the provisions of 33 section one of this act, but shall otherwise be subject to the 34 provisions hereof.'
