IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend Section nineteen of Chapter fifty-seven of the Revised Statutes relating to towns receiving devises and gifts for public libraries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Section 1. Section nineteen of chapter fifty-seven of the
- 2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the
- 3 word "combined" in the fifth line of said section the words,
- 4 'Any town, as such may receive, hold and manage devises,
- 5 bequests of gifts for the establishment, increase or mainten-
- 6 ance of public parks and play-grounds in such town; and
- 7 may accept by vote of the legal voters thereof, any land in
- 8 such town to be used as a public park or play-ground, or

9 both combined,' so that said section as amended shall read 10 as follows:

'Section 19. Any town, as such, may receive, hold and manage devises, bequests or gifts for the establishment, increase or maintenance of a public library therein; and may accept by vote of the legal voters thereof, any land or land and buildings thereon, to be used as a public library or art gallery, or both combined. Any town, as such, may receive, hold and manage devises, bequests or gifts for the establishment, increase or maintenance of public parks and play-grounds in such town; and may accept by vote of the legal voters thereof, any land in such town to be used as a public park or play-ground, or both combined. When any planzation is incorporated into a town, such gifts and the pro-
