STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT relating to fenders on street cars.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No street railroad company shall after January first, A. D. nineteen hundred ten, run or operate cars through the streets of any city of over ten thousand inhabitants unless the same is equipped with suitable fenders of such type as shall be approved by the railroad commissioners.

Sect. 2. Any company violating the provisions of this act shall be liable to a penalty of not less than one hundred nor more than five hundred dollars for each day such car is so run or operated, to be recovered by indictment for the use of the city or town in which the offense is committed.
