RESOLVE, in favor of Susan Baker.

---

*Resolved,* That there be paid to Susan Baker, widow of  
2 Forbes Baker, late of Steuben, in Washington county, the  
3 sum of four dollars per month, payable quarterly, from the  
4 fund appropriated for military pensions and to begin July  
5 first, 1909.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Mrs. Susan Baker, widow of Forbes Baker, of Steuben, who was a member of Captain Hiram Burnham's Company of Light Infantry in the detachment of the drafted militia of Maine in the Aroostook war. Mrs. Baker is now a lady ninety-three years of age and in feeble health with no means of support except what she receives by charity. She, therefore, asks that the State should allow her this small pension to assist in making her comfortable in her declining years.
