STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to regulate the use of nets and seines in the tide waters of Narraguagus river and Narraguagus bay, so-called.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Section 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from taking
2 any smelts by means of purse, or by drag seines of any kind,
3 in the tide waters of Narraguagus river or bay, so-called, in
4 the County of Washington, under a penalty of fifty dollars
5 for each offense.

Sect. 2. The penalty for violation of the first section of
2 this act may be recovered by complaint or indictment, and
3 shall belong one-half to the person complaining of said of-
4 fense, and one-half to the inhabitants of the town school in
5 which said offense is committed for the benefit of schools.
