STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to amend Section 38 of Chapter 29 of the Revised States of the State of Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. That Section 38 of the Revised Statutes of the 2 State of Maine be and hereby is amended so that said Sec-3 tion 38, as amended, shall read:

'Sect. 38. No person shall travel from town to town, or 5 from place to place, in any city, town or plantation, on foot 6 or by public or private conveyance, either by land or water, 7 carrying for sale or offering for sale intoxicating or fer-8 mented liquors, and no person shall solicit, obtain, or offer 9 to obtain orders for the sale or delivery of any intoxicating 10 or fermented liquors, in any quantity. Any person vio-

11 lating the provisions of this section shall be liable to a pen12 alty of not less than twenty nor more than five hundred dol13 lars and costs for each offense, to be recovered on complaint
14 or by indictment; half to the complainant and half to the
15 county in which the offense is committed; and in default
16 of payment thereof, said person shall be imprisoned for a
17 term of not less than two, nor more than six months.'
