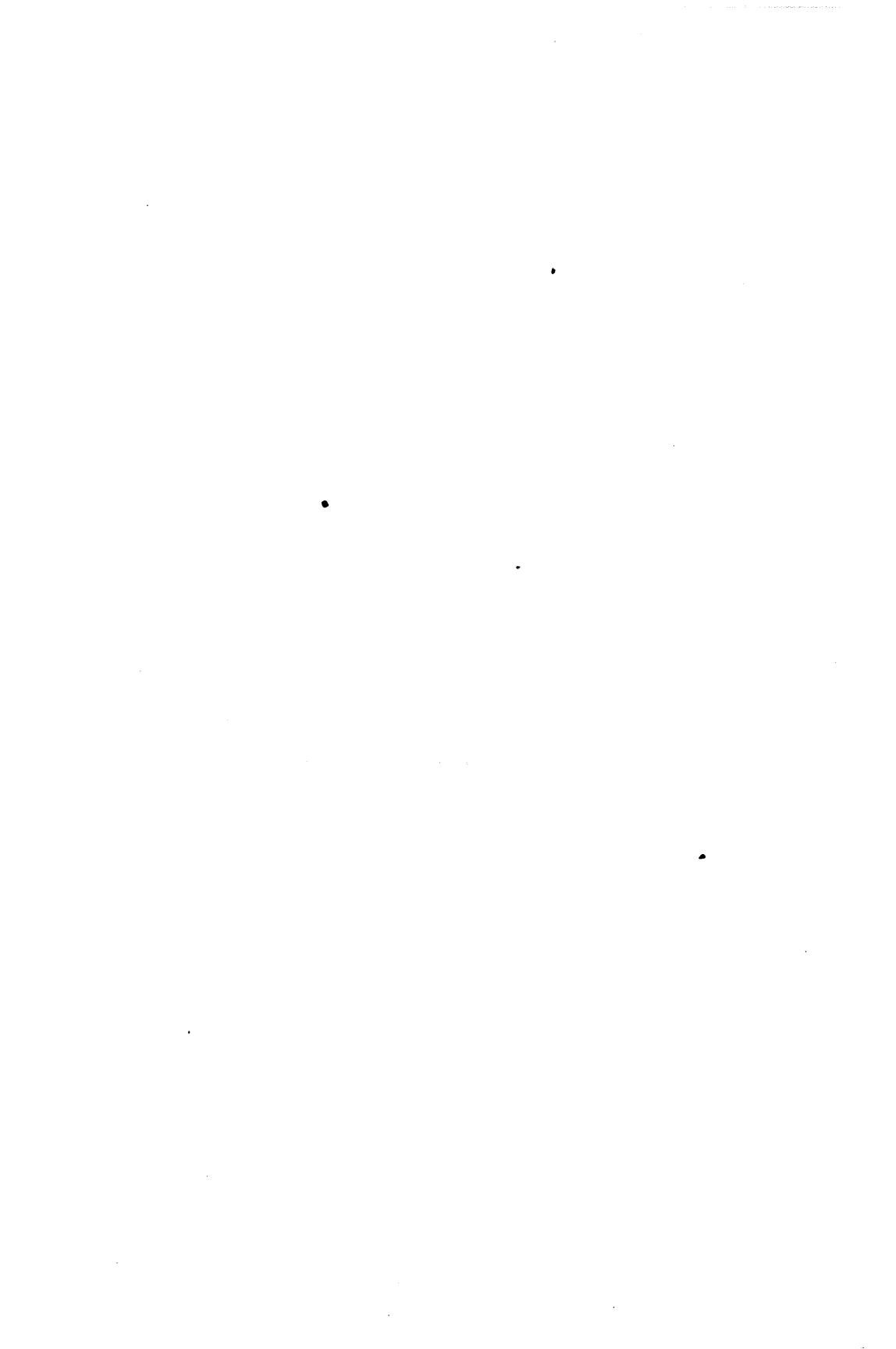
AN ACT to amend section 11 of chapter 32 of the Revised
Statutes relating to the taking of beaver.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 11 of chapter 32 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto the following words:

‘Provided, however, it shall be lawful to kill beaver between the fifteenth day of October and the fifteenth day of December following of each year, in township number one, range five, W. B. K. P., in Franklin county, being “Jim pond township,” so-called, and in all unorganized townships in Somerset county south of a line drawn along the south

10 line of Seboomook township, so-called, to the south line of
11 township number four, range four, N. B. K. P., in said
12 Somerset county, except that it shall be unlawful to take or
13 kill any beaver within one mile of any public sporting camp
14 in Somerset county or within one mile of Moosehead Lake,
15 for a period of two years from the time this act takes effect.'
