STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND NINE.

AN ACT to prohibit corporations from transmitting electric power beyond the confines of the State.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. No corporation, unless expressly authorized 2 so to do by special act of legislation, shall transmit or con3 vey beyond the confines of the State for the purpose of fur4 nishing power, heat or light, any electric current generated 5 directly or indirectly by any water power in this State; nor 6 sell or furnish, directly or indirectly, to any person, firm or 7 corporation, any electric current so generated to be transmitted or conveyed beyond the confines of the State for any 9 of such purposes. Nothing in this act, however, shall pre-

vent any railroad corporation doing business in this State from transmitting electric current, however generated, beyond the confines of the State for the purpose of operating its road between some point in this State and any point or points beyond its confines.

Sect. 2. Any corporation violating any of the provisions 2 of this act may be dissolved and its franchises be forfeited 3 to the State upon proper proceedings to be instituted by the 4 attorney general whenever directed by the Governor.

Sect. 3. This act shall not apply to any corporation now 2 engaged in conveying or transmitting electric current be-3 youd the confines of the State or chartered or empowered so 4 to do nor affect or impair any existing contracts for the 5 transmission of electric current beyond the confines of the 6 State.
