STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Folly Pond, so called, situated in
the town of York, in the county of York.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. No person shall fish for, take, catch or kill any
2 kind of fish at any time in Folly pond, so called, situated in
3 the town of York, county of York, for a period of three
4 years from the time this act takes effect. It shall also be
5 unlawful for any person to have in possession any kind of
6 fish taken in violation of this section.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general
3 law of the state for the illegal fishing for, taking, catching,
4 killing or having in possession of trout or land-locked salmon.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and
2 police courts and trial justices within their respective coun-
3 ties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent juris-
4 diction with the supreme judicial and superior courts, and all
5 fines, forfeitures and penalties received for violation of this
6 act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same
7 to the state treasurer.
