## STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate ice fishing in Rodgers or Ripley Pond, so called, in the town of Ripley, county of Somerset.

Be it enacted by the Pcople of the State of Maine, as follows: Section 1. It shall be lawful to fish through the ice in
2 Rodgers or Ripley pond, so called, in the town of Ripley,
3 county of Somerset, on Wednesday of each week; during
4 the open season for ice fishing in said Rodgers or Ripley
5 pond, so called, provided by this section, it shall be unlawful
6 for any person to take, catch, kill or have in possession more
7 than ten fish in all in any one day taken from said pond.
8 Not more than five set lines can be used by one family while
9 fishing through the ice, as provided in this section, in said
10 Rodgers or Ripley pond, so called. It shall be unlawful for

11 any person to have in possession any kind of fish taken in12 close season in said Rodgers or Ripley pond.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall2 be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general3 law of the state for the illegal fishing for, taking, catching,4 killing or having in possession of trout or land-locked salmon.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and 2 police courts and trial justices, within their respective coun-3 ties, shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent juris-4 diction with the supreme judicial and superior courts, and 5 all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for violation of 6 this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving the 7 same to the state treasurer.
