## STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, A Memorial to the Members of Congress to promote the efficiency of the Life-Saving Service.

Whereas, the United States Senate has passed Senate Bill

- 2 No. 5677, entitled "To Promote the Efficiency of the Life-
- 3 Saving Service," and said bill is now in the Committee of
- 4 Interstate and Foreign Commerce of the House of Repre-
- 5 sentatives in Congress; and

Whereas, we believe that the officers and members of the

- 7 United States Life-Saving Service should receive from the
- 8 government the same treatment in regard to retirement, long
- 9 service pay, etc., as is given to the rank and file of the army
- 10 and navy of the United States, and in lieu of the fact that
- 11 from the hazardous and valuable work which the life-savers
- 12 perform, the vast amount of value and the great number of
- 13 lives which they save from the perils of the sea, and that

14 said service is a branch of the government service which 15 pays back to the public a great profit of what it costs to 16 maintain it; and that articles of enlistment compel them 17 to serve with the army and navy during war:

Be it resolved, That they should be entitled to all privileges 19 as given to the aforesaid bodies, and

Be it resolved, That we earnestly request early and favorable action upon Senate Bill No. 5677 by the House of Representatives in Congress assembled, for retirement and relief, as recommended by the Honorable S. I. Kimball, general superintendent of the United States Life-Saving Service, and approved by the Honorable Secretary of the United States Treasury.

Be it further resolved, That the Secretary of State be and 28 hereby is directed to immediately transmit a copy of these 29 resolution to the Honorable S. I. Kimball and to the Honorable Secretary of the Treasury, Washington, D. C., and to 31 members of Congress from this state.
