### STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of a fish hatchery at Tunk Pond.

Resolved. That the sum of three thousand dollars be and

- 2 is hereby appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and
- 3 eleven, also two thousand dollars for the year nineteen hun-
- 4 dred and twelve for the purpose of acquiring suitable land
- 5 and erecting a suitable fish hatchery and feeding station
- 6 for the artificial propagation of fish at Tunk Pond, in Han-
- 7 cock County, said amounts to be expended by the commis-
- 8 sioners of inland fisheries and game under the direction of
- 9 the Governor and Council.

All money necessary to carry out the provisions of this II resolve shall be taken from the general appropriation for 12 fish hatcheries and feeding stations.



#### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This resolve is really a re-appropriation of above amounts, as a similar resolve was passed in 1909 for a hatchery to be built in Washington County, and owing to the fact that the commissioners did not find a suitable location in Washington County the hatchery was not built. They strongly recommend a location at the outlet of Tunk Pond, which is just across the line in Hancock County.
