STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section three of chapter one hundred and ninety-nine of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred three relating to the Brownville and Williamsburg Water Company.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section three of Chapter 199 of the Private and Special Laws of 1903 is hereby amended by inserting in the sixth line thereof and after the word "corporation", the words 'including the carrying, collecting, distributing and disposing of sewerage matter in general', so that said section shall read as follows:

'Sect. 3. The said corporation is hereby authorized to lay, construct and maintain its lines of pipe in the towns of

9 Brownville and Williamsburg, and to build and maintain
10 all necessary structures therefor at such places as shall be
11 necessary for the purposes of said corporation, including
12 the carrying, collecting, distributing and disposing of sew-
13 erage matter in general, and to cross any water-course, pri-
14 vate or public sewer or to change the direction thereof when
15 necessary for their said purpose of incorporation, but in such
16 manner as not to obstruct or impair the use thereof, and the
17 said corporation shall be liable for any injury caused
18 thereby.'
