RESOLVE in favor of Richard Stuart.

Resolved, That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum
2 of twenty-five dollars (\$25) for services and ten dollars
3 (\$10) for mileage to be paid Richard Stuart of Newport
4 for attendance as an officer during the organization of the
5 House of Representatives.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Richard Stuart was a Page of the House of Representatives of the 74th Legislature (1909-10) and was in attendance at the organization of the House of Representatives of this, the 75th Legislature.
