# STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend chapter three hundred and sixty-nine of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eightynine, entitled "An Act regulating the appointment of the members of the Police Force of the City of Bangor."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. Sections five and six of chapter three hundred
and sixty-nine of the private and special laws of eighteen
hundred and eighty-nine are hereby amended by striking out
all of said sections and inserting the following:

'Sect. 5. In the month of June annually the chief of police 6 shall select from those members of the police force who have 7 served at least one year continuously prior to such selection,

8 one member of the force to be a deputy chief of police, one 9 member to be inspector of police, three or more members to 10 be captains of police and three or more members to be ser-11 geants of police, each to hold office for the following year 12 and until reappointed or relieved by the appointment of an-13 other in his place.

'Said appointments to be subject to confirmation by the 15 municipal officers of said city.

'Sect. 6. The chief of police shall be elected by written 17 ballot in convention of the board of aldermen and common 18 council of the city of Bangor as provided by law and the 19 ordinances of said city.

'Any person, who at the time of his election as chief of 21 police is a regular member of the police force of said city, 22 may at the termination of his office as chief of police resume 23 his position as a member of said force.'
