STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section twenty-seven of chapter fifteen of
the Revised Statutes relating to public school attendance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section twenty-seven of chapter fifteen of the
2 revised statutes is hereby amended by adding after the last
3 word of said section the following: 'and every child between
4 the said ages shall have the right to attend the public schools
5 in the town in which his parent or guardian has a legal resi-
6 dence, subject to such reasonable regulations as to the num-
7 bers and qualifications of pupils to be admitted to the re-
8 spective schools and as to other school matters as the school
9 committee shall from time to time prescribe'; so that said
10 section when amended shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 27. The age of pupils allowed to attend the public
12 schools of the state is hereby fixed between the ages of five
13 and twenty-one years and every child between the said ages
14 shall have the right to attend the public schools in the town
15 in which his parent or guardian has a legal residence, sub-
16 ject to such reasonable regulations as to the numbers and
17 qualifications of pupils to be admitted to the respective
18 schools and as to other school matters as the school com-
19 mittee shall from time to time prescribe.’
