STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section twenty-seven of chapter fifteen of the Revised Statutes relating to public school attendance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section twenty-seven of chapter fifteen of the
2 revised statutes is hereby amended by adding after the last
3 word of said section the following: 'and every child between
4 the said ages shall have the right to attend the public schools
5 in the town in which his parent or guardian has a legal resi6 dence, subject to such reasonable regulations as to the num7 bers and qualifications of pupils to be admitted to the re8 spective schools and as to other school matters as the school
9 committee shall from time to time prescribe'; so that said
10 section when amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 27. The age of pupils allowed to attend the public schools of the state is hereby fixed between the ages of five and twenty-one years and every child between the said ages shall have the right to attend the public schools in the town in which his parent or guardian has a legal residence, subject to such reasonable regulations as to the numbers and qualifications of pupils to be admitted to the respective schools and as to other school matters as the school committee shall from time to time prescribe.'
