RESOLVE ratifying the proposed amendment to the Constitution of the United States, giving Congress power to lay and collect taxes on incomes.

---

*Resolved, That whereas the Congress of the United States*  
2 *has proposed an amendment to the Constitution of the*  
3 *United States which provides that "The Congress shall have*  
4 *power to lay and collect taxes on incomes from whatever*  
5 *source derived without apportionment among the several*  
6 *states and without regard to any census or enumeration."*

And whereas it requires the ratification of three-fourths of  
8 all the states to make the proposed amendment a part of the  
9 Constitution,

Therefore, Resolved that the Legislature of Maine ratifies  
11 and adopts the proposed amendment to the Federal Consti-  
12 tution.
