STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE ratifying the proposed amendment to the Constitution of the United States, giving Congress power to lay and collect taxes on incomes.

Resolved, That whereas the Congress of the United States

- 2 has proposed an amendment to the Constitution of the
- 3 United States which provides that "The Congress shall have
- 4 power to lay and collect taxes on incomes from whatever
- 5 source derived without apportionment among the several
- 6 states and without regard to any census or enumeration."

And whereas it requires the ratification of three-fourths of 8 all the states to make the proposed amendment a part of the 9 Constitution,

Therefore, Resolved that the Legislature of Maine ratifies 11 and adopts the proposed amendment to the Federal Constitution.
