STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section ninety-five of Chapter forty-nine of the Revised Statutes of nineteen hundred and three, as amended by Chapter one hundred twenty-one of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and five, as amended by Chapter one hundred seventy of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and seven, relating to notice of injury to casualty insurance companies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section ninety-five of Chapter forty-nine of the
2 Revised Statutes of nineteen hundred and three, as amended
3 by Chapter one hundred twenty-one of the Public Laws of
4 nineteen hundred and five, as amended by Chapter one hun-

5 dred seventy of the Public Laws of nineteen hundred and
6 seven, is hereby amended, so as to read as follows:

‘Section 95. No conditions, stipulations or agreements
8 contained in any application for insurance in any foreign or
9 domestic casualty or accident insurance company, or in any
10 way made by any such company, limiting the time within
11 which notice of the accident or injury, or death, shall be
12 given to such company to a period of less than thirty days
13 after the happening of the accident, or injury, or death, shall
14 be given to such company to a period of less than thirty days
15 after the happening of the accident or injury, or death, shall
16 be valid, said notice may be given to the company insuring
17 within a reasonable time after the happening of the acci-
18 dent, or injury, or death, and shall be valid and binding on
19 the company.’

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
