STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, for the introduction of the Hungarian Partridge
in the State of Maine.

Resolved: That the sum of five hundred dollars be and
2 is hereby appropriated to be expended by the Commissioners
3 of Inland Fisheries and Game for the purpose of importing
4 Hungarian partridge, to be liberated in such places in the
5 State of Maine as the Commissioners may deem suitable.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

In 1909 a Sportsman's Club in Cumberland County, by private subscription, raised sufficient funds to import a small number of Hungarian partridges, which were liberated in Cumberland, York and Oxford Counties. The results have been so satisfactory that the people feel that the State should aid in this work, at least to a small extent, for it appears that this is a valuable game bird and one well adapted to our climate.
