STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to provide for the trapping of bob cats, loupcevier and Canada lynx in the townships known as Letter A. and Leavitt, in the county of Aroostook, without a trapping license, during open season on mink, sable, muskrat and fisher.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. During the open season now provided by law on mink, sable, muskrat and fisher, it shall be lawful for citizens of this state to hunt and trap bob cats, loupcevier or Canada lynx, without first procuring a trapping license of the Commissioners of Inland Fisheries and Game, in the unincorporated places known as Letter A and Leavitt, in the county of Aroostook.

Sect. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.
