STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to prohibit the hunting of ducks and other water-
fowl in Saco Bay, in York and Cumberland Counties, by use
of steam, naphtha, or gasoline boats.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person at any
2 time in any boat propelled by steam, gasoline, electricity,
3 or any power other than sail or hand power, in the waters
4 of Saco Bay, to chase, hunt, gun or shoot any sea bird,
5 ducks or water-fowl, under a penalty of not less than twen-
6 ty-five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, and costs
7 for each offense.

For the purposes of this act, Saco Bay shall be considered
9 to be the waters lying within those points of land marked

10 by Cape Elizabeth Light, in the town of Cape Elizabeth,
11 on the east, and by Wood Island Light near the entrance
12 to Saco River, on the west.

Sect. 2. In all prosecutions arising under this act, mu-
2 nicipal and police courts, and trial justices, within their
3 respective counties, shall have, upon complaint, original and
4 concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme and superior
5 courts, and all fines, forfeitures and penalties, received
6 for violation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the per-
7 son receiving the same to the state treasurer.
