STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Tom Pond, so-called, sometimes called Thomas Pond or Lake Keoka, in the town of Waterford, county of Oxford.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. There shall be an annual close time for fish-2 ing for any kind of fish in Tom pond, so-called, sometimes
3 called Thomas pond or Lake Keoka, in the town of Wa-4 terford, in the county of Oxford, from the first day of
5 October of each year to the fifteenth day of June of the
6 following year, both days inclusive, during which close
7 time it shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any
8 kind of fish at any time in said lake. It shall also be un-

9 lawful for any person to have in possession any kind of 10 fish taken in close time in the above named lake.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this 2 act shall be subject to the same penalty as is provided in 3 the general law of the state for the illegal fishing for or 4 taking, catching, killing or having in possession of trout or 5 land-locked salmon.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act, mu-2 nicipal and police courts and trial justices within their re-3 spective counties shall have, upon complaint, original and 4 concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and su-5 perior courts, and all fines, penalties and forfeitures re-6 ceived for any violation of this act shall be paid forthwith 7 by the person receiving the same to the state treasurer.
