STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in the town of Durham, in the
County of Androscoggin, and to repeal Chapter one hundred
and fifty of the Private and Special Laws of 1909.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch
2 or kill any kind of fish at any time in any pond, brook or
3 river in the town of Durham, in the county of Androscog-
4 gin, except on Thursday, Friday and Saturday of each
5 week from the time the ice is out of the pond, brook or
6 river fished in the spring of each year until October first
7 following, on which days it shall be lawful to fish in any
8 pond, brook or river in said town of Durham in accord-
9 ance with the general law of the state. It shall also be

10 unlawful for any person to have in possession any kind of
11 fish taken in violation of any provision of this section.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall
2 be subject to the same penalty as is provided by the gen-
3 eral law of the state for the illegal fishing for or taking,
4 catching, killing or having in possession of trout or land-
5 locked salmon.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act, mu-
2 nicipal and police courts and trial justices within their re-
3 spective counties shall have, upon complaint, original and
4 concurrent jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and su-
5 perior courts, and all fines, forfeitures and penalties re-
6 covered by any person for any violation of this act shall
7 be paid forthwith by the person receiving the same to the
8 state treasurer.

Sect. 4. Chapter one hundred and fifty of the Private
2 and Special Laws of 1909, relating to fishing in the town
3 of Durham, in the county of Androscoggin, is herewith re-
4 pealed.
