STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate ice fishing in Lake Wassokeag, so-called, in the town of Dexter, in the county of Penobscot.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or

kill any kind of fish on or through the ice in Lake Wassokeag, so-called, in the town of Dexter, in the county of Penobscot, except on Wednesday and Saturday of each week
said pond is closed by ice, on which days it shall be lawful
to fish through the ice in said pond in accordance with the
general law of the state. Provided, however, it shall be
unlawful for any person to take, catch or kill in any one day
while fishing through the ice in said lake more than ten

10 pounds of fish in all. It shall also be unlawful for any per-11 son to have in possession any kind of fish taken in violation 12 of any provision of this section.

- Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall 2 be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general 3 law of the state for the illegal fishing for or taking, catch-4 ing or killing of trout or land-locked salmon.
- Sect. 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act, muni-2 cipal and police courts and trial justices within their respec-3 tive counties shall have, upon complaint, original and con-4 current jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior 5 courts, and all fines, forfeitures and penalties recovered by 6 any person for any violation of this act shall be paid forth-7 with by the person receiving the same to the state treasurer.
