STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of Frank W. Buckman, Secretary of the Commission of Pharmacy.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated out 2 of any funds of the State not otherwise appropriated the 3 sum of eleven hundred and fifty-six dollars and forty-three 4 cents, to be paid to Frank W. Buckman, Secretary of the 5 Commission of Pharmacy for the benefit of said commission 6 and to make up the deficiency incurred by said commission 7 during the year nineteen hundred and ten.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The total expenses of the Commission of Pharmacy from January 1, 1910 to December 31, 1910, including printing and binding amounted to twenty-three hundred and thirty-six dollars and thirty-seven cents. Of this amount eleven hundred and fifty-six dollars and forty-three cents is still due the commission and unpaid. There is no appropriation from which to take this amount of money and it must be provided for by a deficiency appropriation. The amounts due the members of the commission to be paid out of this appropriation are as follows:
