STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section 16 of Chapter 81 of the Revised Statutes as amended by Chapter 219 of the Public Laws of 1909, relating to county attorneys.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 16 of Chapter 81 of the Revised Statutes as amended by Chapter 219 of the Public Laws of 1909 is hereby amended by substituting a period in place of a comma as a punctuation mark after the "years" in the fifth line thereof; and said section is hereby further amended by striking out all that part of said section beginning with the word "Unless" in the fifth line of said section, and ending with the word "thereon" in the sixteenth line of said section, so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 16. County attorneys shall be elected and notified,
11 their elections determined and vacancies filled in the same
12 manner, and they shall enter upon the discharge of their
13 duties at the same time as is provided respecting county
14 commissioners, but they shall hold office for two years. None
15 but a permanent resident of the county shall hold the office
16 of county attorney and removal therefrom vacates the
17 office.’
