STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, In Favor of the Town of Hermon.

Resolved, That the sum of forty-six dollars be and hereby
2 is appropriated to be paid to the town of Hermon, to reim-
3 burse said town for amount expended for support of Mrs.
4 Erick Nelson, a state pauper.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This claim was not filed with the Governor and Council in the usual manner for the reason that the municipal officers of Hermon supposed that this pauper had a settlement in the town of Kingman. It was discovered later that she was a state pauper, under the alien law, so-called, but it was then too late to file the claim in the usual manner; the time limit provided by law having expired.
