STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to protect striped or sea bass, in the waters of the Sheepscot River and its tributaries.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. It shall be unlawful to fish for or catch striped
2 or sea bass in the waters of the Sheepscot River and its at3 tributaries except by hook and line.

Sect. 2. Any person convicted of fishing or catching 2 striped or sea bass in any other way except by hook and 3 line shall be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars 4 nor more than twenty-five dollars, by complaint or indict-5 ment. One-half to the use of the complainant and one-half 6 to the county. Full jurisdiction to impose such fine is here-7 by conferred upon trial justices.
