STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to prohibit the use of automobiles and motor vehicles on one of the ways of the town of Waterford, for two years.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. For a period of two years no automobile or 2 motor vehicle shall be set up, used, driven or operated in or 3 on the highway in the town of Waterford, in Oxford coun-4 ty, leading from Harrison and Bridgton along the east side 5 of Bear Pond, so-called, said way being narrow, crooked 6 and very dangerous.

Sect. 2. Whoever sets up, uses, drives or operates any 2 automobile or motor vehicle contrary to the provisions of 3 section one hereof, shall on the first conviction be punished

4 by a fine of ten dollars and cost of prosecution, and on the 5 second and every subsequent conviction shall be punished by 6 a fine of twenty dollars and cost of prosecution or by im-7 prisonment not exceeding thirty days.
