### STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to improve certain state lands.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. All that portion of the state lands situate in the
2 city of Augusta and lying between State Street on the west
3 and the location of the Maine Central Railroad Company,
4 on the east is hereby created a public park.

Sect. 2. The supervision, direction and control of same 2 is hereby vested in a commission of three to be appointed 3 by the Governor.

Sect. 3. The commissioners provided for in Section two 2 of this act shall be appointed for a term of four years and 3 shall serve without compensation.

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Sect. 4. One of the commissioners provided for in Sec-2 tion two of this act shall be a resident of the city of Au-3 gusta recommended to the Governor for appointment by the 4 City Council of Augusta.

Sect. 5. To effectuate the purposes of this act, there is 2 hereby appropriated the sum of six hundred dollars for 3 the year 1911 and the sum of six hundred dollars for the 4 year 1912, provided that the city of Augusta for the corre-5 sponding period appropriates for such purposes an amount 6 equal to fifty per cent of the sum so appropriated by the 7 state.

Sect. 6. The commissioners provided for in Section two 2 of this act shall be and hereby are authorized to receive 3 monies by gift of legacy and shall hold same as trustees for 4 the purposes stated in Section one of this act.

Sect. 7. The expenditure of all monies provided for in 2 this act shall be under the direction of the commissioners 3 provided for in Section two of this act, and an annual re-4 port of the same in detail shall be made to the Governor 5 and Council.

Sect. 8. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith 2 are hereby repealed.
