STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of Helen B. Hobart for State Pension.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury of the State
2 to Helen B. Hobart of Farmington, a pension of eight dol-
3 lars per month, beginning on the first day of January, nine-
4 teen hundred and eleven and to continue during the pleas-
5 ure of the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Helen B. Hobart of Farmington, widow of Daniel P. Hobart, to whom a pension was granted by special act of the Seventy-fourth Legislature, House Document No. 213; said Daniel P. Hobart having died on the twenty-third day of June, nineteen hundred and nine, leaving his widow, Mrs. Helen B. Hobart, now seventy years of age, in feeble health and in destitute circumstances, having no relative or other person to whom she can look for any material assistance, her family consisting of herself and a daughter about twenty-five years of age and also in poor health, not being able to work and assist her mother to any material extent. She has another daughter and a son, both of whom are married and have families and in poor circumstances and not able to assist Mrs. Hobart in any way. For a more particular description of the service rendered by said Daniel P. Hobart, reference is had to Document No. 213 of the Seventy-fourth Legislature. She is not pensionable under either United States or State law, and therefore, asks relief from the state by special act.
