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STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

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AN ACT to amend Section thirteen of Chapter one hundred seventeen of the Revised Statutes relating to fees of witnesses.

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*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. Section 13 of Chapter 117 of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words "one dollar and fifty cents." in the second line thereof, and substituting therefor the words 'two dollars,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 13. Witnesses in the supreme judicial or superior courts, and in the probate court shall receive two dollars, or before the county commissioners one dollar for each day's attendance, and six cents for each mile's travel going out and returning home; and before a justice of the peace, a trial justice, a judge of a municipal or police court, referees, auditors

12 or commissioners specially appointed to take testimony, fifty  
13 cents a day for attendance, and for travel, the same as at the  
14 courts aforesaid.'
