SENATE AMENDMENT "A" TO SENATE DOCU-
MENT 70.

Section 2 to be amended by inserting after the word "chap-
2 ter" and before the words "thirty-nine" in the fourteenth
3 line thereof the words 'four hundred,' so that said section
4 when amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 2. The said Atlantic Shore Railway shall hence-
6 forth have, exercise and enjoy all the rights, powers, privi-
7 leges and franchises formerly belonging to the said Atlantic
8 Shore Line Railway on the first day of December, in the
9 year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and ten, and
10 granted to it under the general laws of the state of Maine,
11 and chapter one hundred and seventy-five of the private and

12 special laws of the state of Maine approved March thirteen,
13 one thousand nine hundred and three; chapter two hundred
14 and forty-one of the private and special laws of the state
15 of Maine approved March seventeen, one thousand nine
16 hundred and five; chapter three hundred and three of the
17 private and special laws of the state of Maine approved
18 March twenty, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and
19 chapter four hundred and thirty-nine of the private and
20 special laws of the state of Maine approved March twenty-
21 eight, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and shall ex-
22 ercise and enjoy the same as fully and in the same manner
23 as the said Atlantic Shore Line Railway was authorized to
24 exercise and enjoy the same under the general laws of the
25 state of Maine and under said private and special laws above
26 referred to; subject, however, to the same conditions and
27 limitations as are therein or under the general laws of this
28 state imposed, and to all prior liens thereon by virtue of any
29 valid conveyance thereof by mortgage deed or otherwise,
30 existing prior to April second, one thousand nine hundred
31 and six.'
