STATE OF MAINE

Ordered, The Senate concurring, that the Governor shall appoint three attorneys-at-law, citizens of this state, who shall constitute a committee, and who during the recess of the Legislature shall examine carefully into the matter of municipal courts throughout the State and of trial justice courts therein, and by bill or otherwise report to the next Legislature, to the end that a law or laws may be enacted making more uniform the jurisdiction, practice and procedure in such municipal courts, and determining and defining the jurisdiction of trial justices in localities where municipal courts exist.
