STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section one of Chapter eighty-four of the
Revised Statutes relating to order of notice by the Supreme
Judicial Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section 1 of chapter 84 of the Revised Statutes
2 is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the follow-
3 ing: 'And any order or notice that the court may grant may
4 be ordered by a justice in vacation,' so that said section as
5 amended may read as follows: 'No action can be entered
6 after the first day of the session of the Supreme Judicial
7 Court without special permission. When it appears that the
8 defendant has not had sufficient notice, the court may order
9 such further notice as it deems proper. Any justice of the

10 Supreme Judicial or of either Superior Court may order
11 notice concerning any civil proceeding in or out of term
12 time, directing how it shall be given; and such order, when
13 made in vacation, shall be indorsed on the process. And
14 any order or notice that the court may grant may be ordered
15 by a justice in vacation.'
