STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT relating to fishing in the tributaries to Jim pond and
in Jim brook, in Township Number one, Range five, W. B. K.
P., or Jim Pond Township, so-called, in the county of Frank-
lin.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to take,
2 catch or kill more than twenty-five trout or land-locked sal-
3 mon in all in any of the tributaries to Jim pond, in Town-
4 ship Number one, Range five, W. B. K. P., or Jim Pond
5 Township, so-called, in the county of Franklin, in any one
6 day, during the open season now provided by law on said
7 waters.

Sect. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch

2 or kill more than ten trout in Jim brook, so-called, in Town-
3 ship Number one, Range five, W. B. K. P., or Jim Pond
4 Township, so called, in said county of Franklin, in any one
5 day during the open season now provided by law on said
6 waters, and it shall also be unlawful for any person to take
7 any trout in said Jim brook less than eight inches in length.

Sect. 3. It shall also be unlawful for any person to have
2 in possession any trout or land-locked salmon taken in viola-
3 tion of any provision of this act.

Sect. 4. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be
2 subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general law
3 of the state for the illegal fishing for, or taking, catching,
4 killing or having in possession of trout or land-locked sal-
5 mon.

Sect. 5. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and
2 police courts and trial justices within their respective coun-
3 ties shall have upon complaint, original and concurrent jur-
4 isdiction with the supreme judicial and superior courts, and
5 all fines, forfeitures and penalties recovered for any viola-
6 tion of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiving
7 the same to the state treasurer.
