STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in favor of aid in building a highway bridge across Moose River, in Jackman Plantation in the county of Somerset.

Resolved: That the sum of five thousand dollars, (\$5000) 2 be and hereby is appropriated to aid in building a highway 3 bridge across Moose River in the plantation of Jackman in 4 the county of Somerset, subject to the following provisions:

Provided, that the sum of two thousand dollars, at least, 6 (\$2000) be raised by the county of Somerset, and the nec-7 essary balance by the plantation of Jackman, in said county 8 of Somerset, which, together with the amount herein appro-9 priated, shall be sufficient to fully complete said bridge with-10 out further aid from the state. And said county of Som-11 erset is hereby authorized and required to raise the sum 12 herein provided for them to raise, by loan, taxation or other-13 wise.

Provided, that said bridge shall be constructed of rein-15 forced concrete, not less than eighteen feet wide.

Provided, also, that the location and erection of said bridge 17 shall be under the supervision of an agent appointed by the 18 Governor and Council.

Said bridge shall be built according to the plans of a com-20 petent engineer, to be approved by the Governor and Coun-21 cil.

The moneys under this resolve shall be paid upon vouchers 23 satisfactory to the Governor and Council.
