STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Whetstone pond, so-called, situated in the town of Kingsbury and in the town of Blanchard, in the county of Piscataquis.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
2 kill any kind of fish on or through the ice in Whetstone pond,
3 so-called, situated in the town of Kingsbury and in the town
4 of Blanchard, in the county of Piscataquis; it shall also be
5 unlawful for any person to have in possession any kind of
6 fish taken on or through the ice in said Whetstone pond.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall 2 be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general

3 law of the state for the illegal taking, catching or killing of 4 trout or land-locked salmon.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions under this act municipal and 2 police courts and trial justices, within their respective coun-3 ties, shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent 4 jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior courts, 5 and all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for any vio-6 lation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person re-7 ceiving the same to the state treasurer.
