## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Hall pond, in the town of Paris, county of Oxford.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. For a period of five years from the time this act

- 2 takes effect it shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch
- 3 or kill any trout less than nine inches in length in Hall pond,
- 4 in the town of Paris, in the county of Oxford; it shall also
- 5 he unlawful for any person to have in possession any trout
- 6 less than nine inches in length taken from said Hall pond;
- 7 it shall also be unlawful for any person to take, catch or kill
- 8 more than five trout in said Hall Pond in any one day during
- 9 said period of five years from the time this act takes effect.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be

- 2 subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor more
- 3 than thirty dollars for each offense and one dollar additional
- 4 for every trout caught, taken, killed or had in possession in
- 5 violation of any provisions of this act.
- Sect. 3. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and
- 2 police courts and trial justices, within their respective coun-
- 3 ties, shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent
- 4 jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior courts.
- 5 and all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for any vio-
- 6 lation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person re-
- 7 ceiving the same to the state treasurer.
