IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in the tributaries of Big Concord pond, in the town of Woodstock, in the county of Oxford, and to repeal Chapter 347 of the Private and Special Laws of 1905.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish or, take, catch or  
2 kill any kind of fish at any time in any of the tributaries of  
3 Big Concord pond, in the town of Woodstock, in the county  
4 of Oxford, except it shall be lawful to fish in any of said  
5 tributaries on Wednesday and on Friday of each week in  
6 accordance with the general law of the state.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall  
2 be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general

3 law of the state for the illegal taking, catching, killing or  
4 having in possession of trout or landlocked salmon.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act, munici-  
2 pal and police courts and trial justices, within their respect-  
3 ive counties, shall have, upon complaint, original and con-  
4 current jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior  
5 courts, and all fines, forfeitures and penalties received for  
6 any violation of this act shall be paid forthwith by the per-  
7 son receiving the same to the state treasurer.

Sect. 4. Chapter 347 of the private and special laws of  
2 1909 is hereby repealed.
