IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Chapter 407 of the Private and Special  
Laws of 1903, as amended, relating to ice fishing in Eagle  
Lake, in the town of Eden, county of Hancock.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. So much of chapter 407 of the private and  
2 special laws of 1903 as amended as prohibits fishing through  
3 the ice in accordance with the general law of the state on  
4 Friday and Saturday of each week in Eagle lake, so called,  
5 in the town of Eden, county of Hancock, is hereby repealed.

Sect. 2. During open season for ice fishing in said Eagle  
2 lake it shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch or kill  
3 in any one day more than fifteen pounds of fish in all.

Sect. 3. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall

2 be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general  
3 law of the state for illegal taking, catching, killing or hav-  
4 ing in possession of trout or landlocked salmon.

Sect. 4. In all prosecutions under this act, municipal and  
2 police courts and trial justices within their respective coun-  
3 ties shall have, upon complaint, original and concurrent  
4 jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior courts,  
5 and all fines, forfeitures and penalties recovered for viola-  
6 tion of this act shall be paid forthwith by the person receiv-  
7 ing the same to the state treasurer.
