IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate ice fishing in Fitts pond, sometimes called  
Little Fitts pond, in the town of Clifton, in the county of  
Penobscot.

---

*Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or  
2 kill any kind of fish on or through the ice in Fitts pond,  
3 sometimes called Little Fitts pond, in the town of Clifton,  
4 in the county of Penobscot, for a period of five years from  
5 November first, A. D. 1911, except from February first of  
6 each year until the ice is out of said pond in the spring,  
7 during which time it shall be lawful to fish in said pond  
8 through the ice in accordance with the general law of the  
9 state. It shall also be unlawful to have in possession any

10 kind of fish taken in violation of any provision of this sec-  
11 tion.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall  
2 be subject to the same penalty as is provided in the general  
3 law of the state for the illegal taking, catching or having in  
4 possession of trout or landlocked salmon.

Sect. 3. In all prosecutions arising under this act, munici-  
2 pal and police courts and trial justices within their respect-  
3 ive counties shall have, upon complaint, original and con-  
4 current jurisdiction with the supreme judicial and superior  
5 courts, and all fines, penalties and forfeitures recovered by  
6 any person for any violation of this act shall be paid forth-  
7 with by the person receiving the same to the state treasurer.
