## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND ELEVEN.

AN ACT in relation to the Appointment of Guardians by

Consent.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Whenever any person shall deem himself un-

- 2 fitted by reason of infirmities of age or other mental or
- 3 physical disability for the management of his affairs with
- 4 prudence and understanding, he may apply to the court
- 5 of probate for the county in which he resides for the ap-
- 6 pointment of a guardian over him, and thereupon the judge
- 7 of probate for such county may, after such notice and hear-
- 8 ing as the judge may order, appoint some suitable person
- 9 as guardian over him.

Sect. 2. Such guardian shall give bond to the judge of

2 probate, with sufficient sureties, give notice of his appoint-3 ment in the same manner as guardians of insane persons 4 are required by law to do, and be subject to all provisions 5 of law now in force as to guardians and estates of their 6 wards.
